PowerPoint Slides to Include

Slide No.	Content/Slide Title	Other Information/ Description
1	Title/Subtitle	Name of Wonder Your name, date and period as the Subtitle
2	Location of Wonder	Where is it located? Which country?
3	Description	Describe the wonder – why is it considered a wonder? Is it man-made or natural? When was it made? Who made it? Does it still exist?.
4	History of Wonder and Time Period	Explain the background of the wonder
5	Interesting Facts – at least 3	What are the most interesting facts about your wonder?
6	Conclusion	Summarize the wonder – Why did you choose it?
7	Citations	List all of the sites you used

PowerPoint needs to include

- All information slides follow the 6 X 6 Rule. (at least 3, but no more than 6 bullets and no more than 6 words to a bullet)
- Appropriate animation (title always appears first and remaining text is animated)
- Appropriate transitions
- Consistent background
- Use of color
- A variety of slide layouts – be creative – use autosshapes and smart art
- Appropriate fonts and colors - readable
- Correct spelling and grammar

2.	Title Slide: Includes a title slide with title, your name, date and period	2	
3	Location slide. Include title and an image of a map showing which county wonder is located in.	3	
3.	Description Slide: has a title, at least 3 bullet points, but not more than 6 bullet points. Each point begins with a capital letter. Each point has 6 words or less. Consistent wording for each bullet point. Correct spelling and grammar. Describes the wonder in own words. Tells if it was man-made or natural. Gives relevant information about wonder in own words.	5	
	History Slide: has a title, at least 3 bullet points, but not more than 6 bullet points. Each point begins with a capital letter. Each point has 6 words or less. Consistent wording for each bullet point. Correct spelling and grammar. Gives relevant information about the history of the wonder in own words.	5	
	Interesting Facts Slide(s): has a title, at least 3 bullet points, but not more than 6 bullet points. Each point begins with a capital letter. Each point has 6 words or less. Consistent wording for each bullet point. Correct spelling and grammar. Gives relevant information about interesting facts of the wonder in own words.	5	
	Conclusion Slide –Summarizes the wonder in own words. May explain why this wonder was chosen.	3	
	Citations – Includes a list of web sites used to gather information	2	
4.	Images: There are at least 3 images within the Powerpoint with citations.	3	
5.	Slide Design - Text is formatted properly - readable font, color and size AND spacing is appropriate and consistent. Uses a variety of slide layouts. Shows creativity. Includes images.	3	
6.	Animation adds to the PowerPoint/does not detract from the presentation. All titles appear first on a slide. Each bulleted item appears one at a time. Transitions are appropriate.	2
